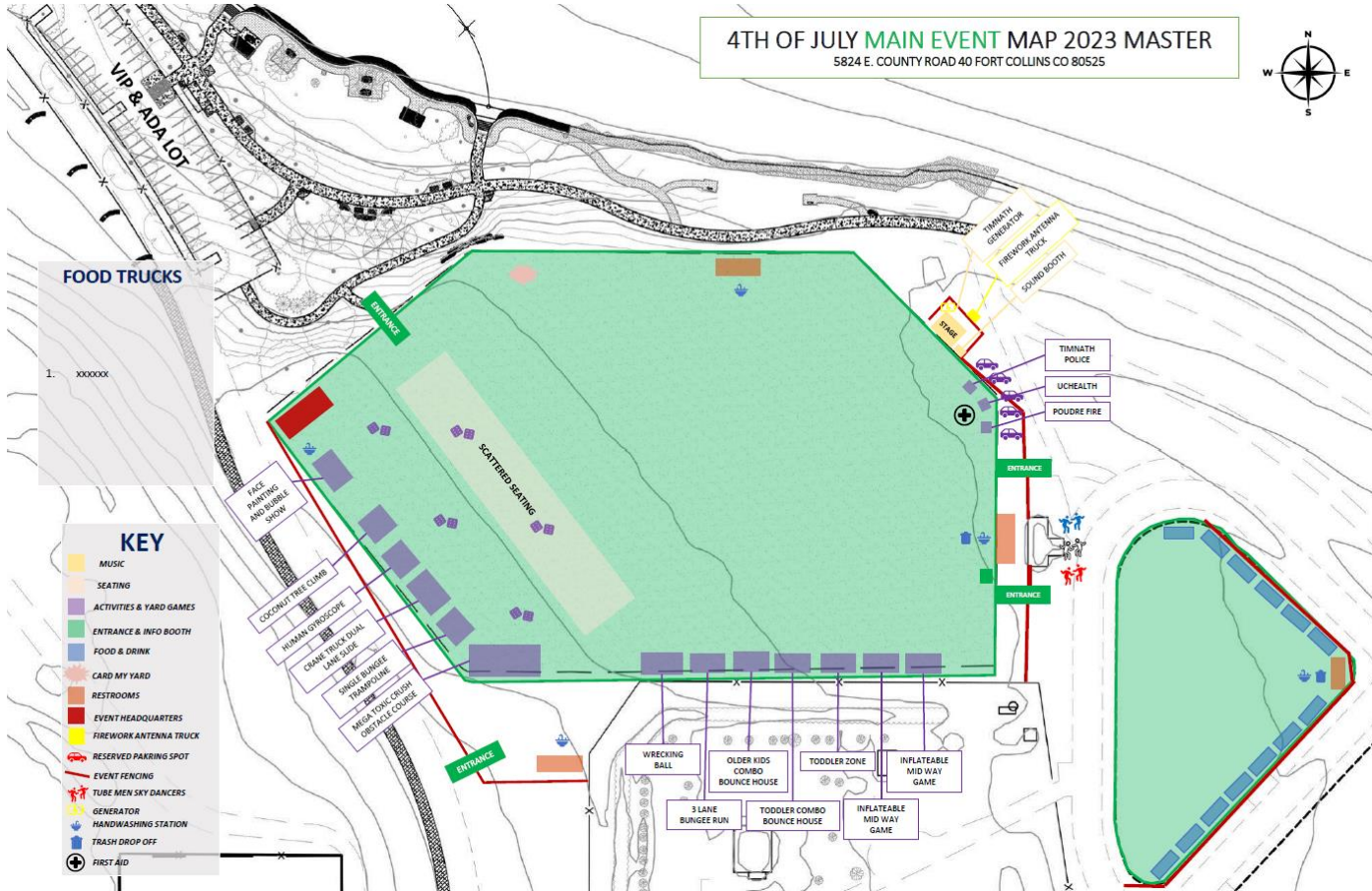


Timnath 4th of July Celebration Emergency Action Plan

Tuesday, July 4th, 2023, 5:00 pm to 10 pm

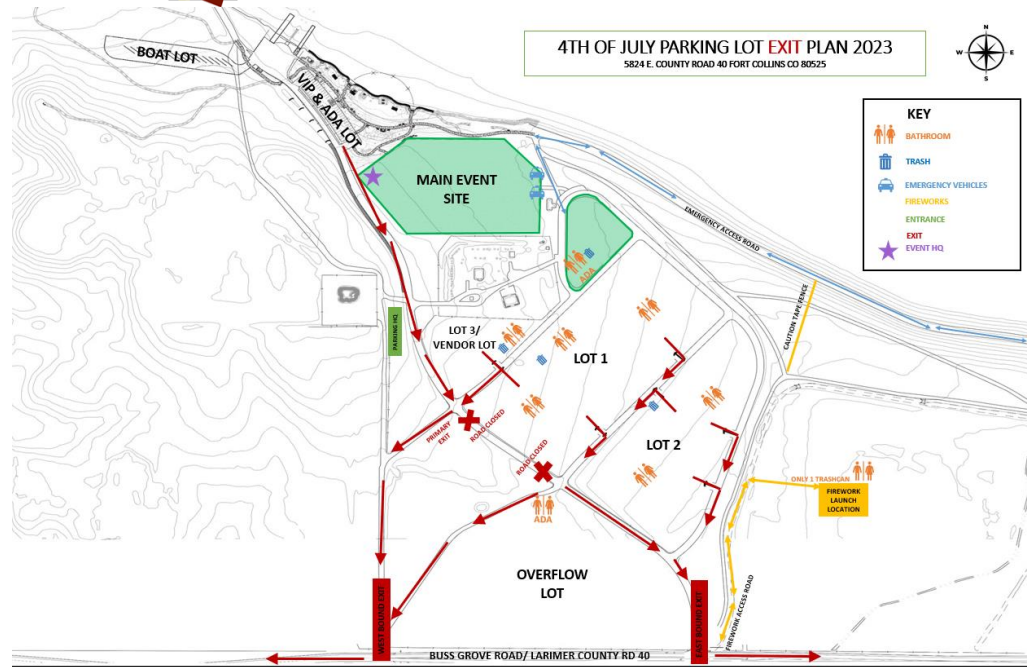
Timnath Reservoir, 5824 E County Road 40, Fort Collins, CO 80525

1. Event Map:



2. Evacuation Procedures

- Follow event exit plan (below)
- Emergency vehicles have dedicated exit/entrance incase of emergency (below in blue)



3. Weather Emergency

- Weather Emergency Protocol (see below for protocol) is put in place when lightning strikes within 5 miles. The event will resume once there have been no strikes within 5 miles for a minimum of 20 minutes. When lightning strikes within 12 miles, we are “on alert” for a potential shut down. All lightning is monitored via weather apps on the event coordinators' and sound technicians' phones.
- Event coordinators are additionally registered with the NORA Weather Alert Team out of Boulder, Colorado which monitors weather conditions for the 4th of July Celebration.
- Our stage is equipped with an anemometer to monitor wind speeds and is monitored by Rockfan Entertainment for the entire time the stage is set up. In case of high winds, please refer to our Stage – High Wind Plan: <https://www.dropbox.com/s/0jdfefqavke5x8v/Stage-%20High%20Wind%20Plan.pdf?dl=0>
- Kids' activities are shut down when wind is greater than 15 MPH, at the discretion of Airbound and Big Air Jumpers.
- Weather Emergency Protocol
 - Event staff will shelter in the RV event headquarters
 - All attendees will be encouraged via police vehicle PA to return to their vehicles until the weather passes. Social media will be utilized to communicate with attendees that are off-site or sheltering in their vehicles.

4. Fire Emergency

- Brush truck is staged at the fireworks launch site to monitor fire safety & conditions

5. Medical Emergency

- Call 911 or Larimer County Dispatch at 970-416-1985 for emergencies
- For first aid level of care, direct staff or attendee to the ambulance (located just south of the stage)
- Report all incidents to event coordinators and take detailed notes of incidents if possible – see below list of information to gather
 - Witness names and contact information

- Detailed notes on the incident (who, what, where, when, why, how)
 - Detailed photos
- 6. Bomb Threat/Suspicious Package**
- Report incident to Timnath PD. Chain of command shifts from event coordinators to Timnath PD.
- 7. Active Shooter**
- Call 911
 - Chain of command shifts from event coordinators to Timnath PD
- 8. First Responders (Police, EMT, Fire)**
- Staged just south of the stage (see event map at top of Emergency Action Plan)
 - Incident Command Center for all first responders
 - All first responders have access to golf carts for the duration of the event in case of emergency.
- 9. Fireworks Safety Zone**



- Angel Light Pyrotechnic and event coordinators make decisions on when it is safe to shoot off the fireworks (based on weather conditions)
- Brush truck is staged at the fireworks launch site to monitor fire safety & conditions
- Firework time: 9:35 pm – 9:55 pm
- Fireworks will be delayed only until 10:30 pm
